International House is not just a building; it is an architectural treasure. For three generations, scholars from around the world have traversed its gleaming terracotta floors. Its arches, dome, painted ceilings, and cascading entryway all unite in a reflection of international harmony.

Our home is our most important operational resource, and its preservation and upkeep are critical to our mission. Right now, a minimum of \$8 million is needed to renovate 75-year-old restrooms, showers, and ventilation systems, and to make the facilities accessible to the disabled. Half of this amount will come from the operations budget and investments, but the remaining \$4 million must come from outside sources.

Donors to the Architectural Heritage Fund will enable our faithful stewardship of this facility: replacing dangerously outdated systems, improving safety and comfort, and taking preventative steps to avoid future costly renovations. Your contributions will ensure the preservation of a magnificent and historic building overlooking the Golden Gate—and serving for thousands as a unique bridge to a future of international understanding.



Encompassing 240,000 square feet, this 75-year-old building requires constant vigilance to protect its unique service and purpose.

GIVING OPPORTUNITIES:
