



GATEWAY FELLOWSHIP ENDOWMENTS: KEEPING OUR DOORS OPEN TO DESERVING SCHOLARS.

Without our students, International House is nothing. Some of the world's brightest scholars converge here under one roof, and their interactions may help shape the planet's future. Ph.D. candidates are especially important residents because so many go on to hold important government, academic, and administrative posts.

Unfortunately, many of the best Ph.D. applicants lack the financial means to afford I-House residency, or even the tuition costs of attending UC Berkeley. With tuition and fees now exceeding \$25,000 per year for overseas and out-of-state students, and expected to rise dramatically, too many brilliant graduate scholars find that the gateway to studying at UC Berkeley is closed.

Now, in an unprecedented program, I-House has joined forces with the UC Berkeley Graduate Division to establish Gateway Fellowships—financial aid packages that provide deserving first-year doctoral students with I-House room and board, an annual \$5K spending stipend, and full tuition and fee waivers.

GIVING OPPORTUNITIES:

- \$250K establishes an endowed “Gateway Fellowship” for a first-year doctoral student, providing in perpetuity an annual award of I-House academic-year residency to be matched by UC Berkeley with tuition, fees and a \$5K stipend.
- \$100K establishes a term “Gateway Fellowship” that will provide, for nine consecutive years, awards of academic year I-House residency, to be matched by UC Berkeley with tuition, fees, and a \$5K stipend.
- Gifts of any size can be designated to the I-House “Open Gateway” Endowment Fund, allowing many donors to unite their resources to assist deserving students. Earned income is retained and reinvested until sufficient to support one or more Gateway Fellows, on an annual basis.
- Additional financial aid contributions are welcomed for undergraduate and master's level support. Named endowment funds may be established with a minimum gift of \$50K.
