A Message from Our Executive Director & CEO

Dear Alumni and Friends,

As I reflect on the 2024–2025 academic year, I'm struck by how International House Berkeley has remained true to its mission during a particularly challenging time for higher education. While university campuses across the United States grappled with protests and shifting policies around free speech, I–House continued to serve as a safe home where students could build meaningful connections across cultural differences.

This year tested our community's resilience, but it also demonstrated the strength of our approach to intercultural understanding. When the world felt increasingly polarized, our residents found common ground in shared meals, late-night conversations, and resident-led programming.

The results speak for themselves. Our mid-year free speech survey revealed that 94% of I-House residents felt comfortable expressing controversial opinions to fellow residents and over half reported discussing challenging topics more frequently since becoming I-House residents.

This success didn't happen by accident. It's the result of intentional programming, careful community building, and our commitment to creating an environment where curiosity overcomes judgment.

A resident survey conducted during the 2024–25 academic year revealed that I-House creates an exceptional environment for open dialogue, with residents expressing comfort in sharing controversial opinions — contrasting sharply with nationwide campus trends where students report feeling unsafe expressing their views.

Creating Intercultural Understanding & Respect

Living alongside residents from 80 different countries transforms everyday moments into opportunities for intercultural learning at International House Berkeley. In academic year 2024–2025, our diverse community turned daily interactions — from shared meals in the Dining Commons to late-night conversations in the Great Hall — into experiences of cultural exchange and understanding. Our structured programming amplifies these organic connections.

Fall and Spring Resident Retreats

We started each semester with a series of overnight retreats - launching the resident experience with intentional, curiosity-driven sessions and activities that promote crosscultural understanding, personal growth, and leadership development. Held at a retreat center in the foothills of the Santa Cruz Mountains, residents had the opportunity to build friendships, practice dialogue across differences, and experience traditional camp experiences, such as hiking and s'mores.

Weekly Intercultural Events

Throughout the year, weekly DiversiTEA & Coffee Hours accompanied by themed dinners in the Dining Commons gave residents the opportunity to share their cultures through food, music, dancing, and games. Each event was hosted and organized by residents who decided how they wished to celebrate and showcase their cultures. Among the 27 DiversiTEA & Coffee Hours this year were special nights dedicated to Diwali and Lunar New Year, which are always favorites with the residents.

International Cultural Festival

The year culminated in our International Cultural Festival, representing 30 countries, entirely planned and executed by resident leaders. Themed "Travel the World Without Leaving Berkeley," this celebration was open to the public and showcased the community's diversity through cultural performances, traditional foods, and interactive exhibits many in collaboration with local consulates from represented countries.



Impact in **Action**

These intentional programming efforts create measurable impact on our community's intercultural dialogue.

Learning to Lead Across Cultures

Victor Pezuela Ortiz (IH 2024–25) served as a program lead at International House Berkeley during his year-long exchange from Universidad Carlos III de Madrid. Alongside his law and business classes at UC Berkeley, he got involved in I-House leadership because he wanted to craft memorable experiences for residents. "I just underestimated how much the experience would shape me," he added.

Victor facilitated the planning of several DiversiTEA & Coffee Hours and engaged participants from 30 countries to host booths at our annual International Cultural Festival. Victor consistently fostered inclusivity and positivity, even hand-

delivering 150 roses on Valentine's Day to I-House residents. "I became adept at creating spaces where residents could proudly share something deeply personal: their culture and traditions," he shared.

"What I valued the most about serving as a program lead is that it taught me how to lead in a multicultural environment," Victor reflected. "It pushed me to listen, adapt, and make everyone feel included."

Victor returns to Madrid with a newfound curiosity and openness. "I carry the lessons I learned at I-House — about collaboration, cultural awareness, and creating inclusive spaces — wherever I go."

Finding Home at I-House

Before even stepping on campus, **Susanna Atanessian (IH 2024–25)** wanted to live at International House Berkeley. "It felt like the perfect fit with its mission, community, location, dining, and architecture, along with all the opportunities and experiences I imagined having there," she remembered.

Susanna's interest grew when, as a first-year student on campus, she visited a fellow Armenian student who lived here. "I saw how she made new connections in the dining hall and how someone was always playing amazing music on the piano," she said. "I-House brings together talented, loving, and curious people." Susanna was certain she wanted her own I-House experience.

some of her fees for room and board. She cherished her experiences at I-House, including a close friendship with her roommate from Japan and the opportunity to share her Armenian culture with the community by organizing the first Armenian DiversiTEA & Coffee Hour. "No one even realized I was the only Armenian at I-House, because of the incredible support of my I-House friends," she shared.

"It's unbelievable how every semester the cohort at I-House changes, yet the feeling, unity and vibrancy never do," Susanna reflected. "It's truly a once-in-a-lifetime, and for-a-lifetime experience."



Lifelong Friendships Thrive Worldwide

Ask any recent International House Berkeley graduate or longtime alum what stands out about their I-House experience, and you'll hear the same thing: the friendships. Whether through visits to friends across continents or gatherings back on campus, our alumni community demonstrates the enduring power of cross-cultural friendship.

Some alumni maintain their connections through global adventures — visiting former roommates in their home countries or coordinating international travel with their I–House family. Others find their anchor in Berkeley, returning regularly for our Alumni Reunion Brunch or gathering quarterly at Edmonds' Café to share updates and reminisce. Throughout the 2024–2025 academic year, we hosted more than 250 alumni at I–House events and visits, representing residents from every decade of our history.

Recognizing that our global community deserves global support, we're working together with I-House Berkeley alumni ambassadors in England, Japan, New York, Spain, Washington DC, and beyond to create regional alumni groups. These ambassadors are planning gatherings in their cities ensuring that the I-House spirit thrives wherever our alumni call home. Developing Tomorrow's Global Leaders

International House Berkeley's commitment to nurturing leadership extends beyond traditional programming, offering residents transformative opportunities to develop the skills and cultural intelligence needed to create positive change in their home communities and beyond.

Global Leadership Program

The Global Leadership Program is I-House's signature leadership development experience, combining assessment, intensive training, and real-world application. Last year's 22 participants began with cultural intelligence assessments, then explored cross-cultural communication and collaborative problemsolving through three weekend intensives and personalized coaching sessions. They applied their newly-learned skills by helping plan signature I-House programs, including the Resident Benefit Concert and International Cultural Festival.

Lodestar Speaker Series

The 2024–2025 Lodestar Speaker Series exposed I-House residents to global leadership in action through two dynamic sessions: "After The Vote: Insights from Women Leaders Post–U.S. Elections" featuring elected officials and policy leaders, and "Geopolitics of Al and International Cooperation" with technology strategists, Al researchers, and policy experts. In addition to exposure to global leadership perspectives, resident leaders also gained valuable experience by helping to organize these events and engaging directly with prominent leaders.

Transforming Communities Through Projects for Peace

I-House partners with the Projects for Peace program to empower residents to put their global leadership skills into action in their home countries, providing funding to conduct peace-building initiatives during the summer. Backed by \$10,000 grants, Excellence Joshua (IH 2023-24), Okechukwu Iroegbu (IH 2022-24) and Hussein Orekoya (IH 2023-24) led projects focused on digital empowerment, clean water access, and climate conflict mitigation.

Digital Empowerment in Nigeria

As the founder of a technology incubator in Nigeria, Excellence had empowered women economically through technology. However, in her mother's homeland of Anambra State, Excellence saw the need for a training program to help young men overcome poverty-driven crime. "With technology, opportunities are democratized," she explains. "You don't need to know somebody to make something good out of your life."

While studying for her master's degree in development engineering and living at I-House, Excellence won a Projects for Peace grant to launch her Yatara Rucha training program.

Last summer, 133 men participated in her four-week curriculum, which introduced digital skills and explored career pathways. Participants also engaged in life-enhancement sessions on personal branding, conflict mediation, and civic responsibility.

This project was transformative for Excellence, who reflected, "True peace is achieved not just by removing conflict, but by empowering individuals with the skills and opportunities to build better futures. When we invest in people, we lay the foundation for lasting societal change and harmony."



Preserving Our Mission

As International House Berkeley continues its mission of fostering intercultural understanding, our vision for the future centers on ensuring this historic institution remains a vital center for global community building for generations to come. In today's increasingly polarized world, our mission has never been more vital.

Our nearly century-old building requires continuous investment to remain the welcoming home that has shaped thousands of global leaders. From modernizing rooms to upgrading common spaces, these improvements ensure I-House continues to attract the brightest minds from around the world.

Equally critical is expanding our scholarship support to remove financial barriers that might prevent exceptional students from experiencing I-House. These scholarships do more than support individual dreams — they preserve the diversity that makes our community extraordinary. Whether supporting a future diplomat from Asia, a social entrepreneur from South America, or an innovator from the United States, scholarships allow us to select residents based on their commitment to our mission rather than their ability to pay.




Paying Forward The Gift of Global Perspective

Harry Mynick's (IH 1972-76) path to the Princeton Plasma Physics Lab took an important detour through International House Berkeley, where living among students from around the world broadened his perspective and deepened his interest in global affairs.

Encouraged by his engineer father, Harry pursued math and physics at Yale University, then earned his PhD in physics at UC Berkeley — launching a career in controlled fusion energy. The global collaborations he enjoyed as a scientist echoed the vibrant community and crosscultural exchanges he first experienced during his years at I-House. "At every meal, I could sit down with smart people from all over and exchange views and experiences with them," he remembered. "Sometimes we shared similar perspectives. Sometimes their views were very different from mine, but it was usually enlightening."

Harry feels profoundly fortunate for the path he has been able to follow, and that gratitude has inspired him to pay it forward by supporting young people pursuing technical fields. That's why he established a scholarship fund at I-House, using a qualified charitable donation from his IRA. "In this simple way, I've been able to contribute to helping to make the future a better one," he said.
