About Dr. Espinal:

Dr. Marcos Espinal, a national of the Dominican Republic, has over 20 years of experience as a public health official and communicable diseases researcher. He trained as a pediatrician with three years of residency before turning to research and global public health. From 2003-2010, Dr. Espinal served as Executive Secretary of the WHO Stop TB Partnership, a global movement aimed at eliminating tuberculosis as a public health problem. In 2006, together with Bill Gates, Gordon Brown, Chancellor of England, and Olusegun Obasanjo, President of Nigeria, Dr. Espinal launched the Global Plan to Eliminate Tuberculosis at the World Economic Forum in Davos, Switzerland. Dr. Espinal then spent the next 13 years as a key official at the Pan American Health Organization (PAHO) building global partnerships to address global health issues including tuberculosis, HIV, Zika, and Ebola. Dr. Espinal has published more than 100 peer-reviewed publications in the field of communicable diseases.
